



Mr. Tarkanish Goes to Washington

Stephen Tarkanish and associates of S.T.A.R.S. Productions will be heading to Washington, D.C. to meet with several members of Congress to discuss in great detail the regulatory system and statues that pertain to the entertainment business on a federal level.

S.T.A.R.S. Productions is involved with the Cosmopolitan Hotel being built in Las Vegas, NV, which is scheduled to be launched in 2008 and there major concerns about why some states require licensing from the Department of Labor, including but not limited to unions, on a national level.

"This is very important time period for the entertainment industry and actions must be taken immediately to avoid pitfalls down the road," says Tarkanish. "I am looking forward to these hearings to clear the air on a proactive and not a reactive level."

As former president of the Conference of Personal Managers, Tarkanish has successfully fought and won the independent contractor status to prevail nationally with the Department of Labor when the AFL-CIO, which governs the American Federation of Musicians, tried to label all entertainers and musicians employees for the sole purpose of strengthening the unions.
